In February 2023, the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) Newborn Screening Program became the first in the nation to screen all newborns for congenital CMV.

The webinars are intended for practitioners working with and supporting children and their families in educational settings, such as:

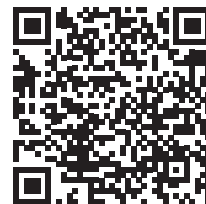
- Early childhood special education and family education staff/administrators.
